- Improved advertising of special church services and events e.g. Easter and Christmas services, Mission Course.
- Followed through on promises to communicate e.g. the results of congregational feedback.
- Set 10 day deadlines on the PCC agenda and minutes.
- Thanked the parish for Christian Aid contributions over 10 years.

### Section 3 – Mission

Last Autumn, as a church, we completed '*mission-shaped intro*' - a course to help us look at the ways the world is changing, and to explore how we, as a church, may change, so we may be relevant to our wider parish community, in that changing world.

We saw clearly that there is a lot we don't know about our local community and therefore that it is important for us to start by 'listening' to those in our community. With listening in mind, we are exploring the possibility of starting:

- A Monday-morning drop-in. The details have to be discussed and agreed between us all, but the idea is that the church is open for anyone, coffee/other drinks and refreshments are available, we spread the word, we see who turns up, we hear their stories and from our conversations we learn about our community and how we may more deeply engage with it.
- 2. A street by street introduction and visiting/prayer programme. This would be following a tried, tested and successful pattern, taking place in a parish not far away. The idea is that it would be a well-managed programme sending a letter introducing ourselves and saying we will knock on a certain day, calling as promised, always giving people the option to have nothing to do with us, but where conversation becomes possible, offering a relationship with St. Mary's, whether that is through prayer for them or some other form of contact or support.
