The Word of God

Monday – Psalm 19.1–6

*The commandment of the Lord is pure
and gives light to the eyes.*

- 1 The heavens are telling the glory of God ◆
and the firmament proclaims his handiwork.
- 2 One day pours out its song to another ◆
and one night unfolds knowledge to another.
- 3 They have neither speech nor language ◆
and their voices are not heard,
- 4 Yet their sound has gone out into all lands ◆
and their words to the ends of the world.
- 5 In them has he set a tabernacle for the sun, ◆
that comes forth as a bridegroom out of his chamber
and rejoices as a champion to run his course.
- 6 It goes forth from the end of the heavens
and runs to the very end again, ◆
and there is nothing hidden from its heat.
