The Greeting

Grace, mercy and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ be with you and also with you. Hosanna to the Son of David.

Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord.

Introduction

The president introduces the celebration using appropriate words

ending .. we may share his risen life.

The people hold up palms or branches while a blessing is said by the president

God our Saviour.....

ending one God, now and for ever. Amen.

The Palm Gospel

When the Gospel is announced the reader says Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Luke.

Glory to you, O Lord.

Luke 19.28-40 is read

This is the Gospel of the Lord.

Praise to you, O Christ.

The Procession to our seats at the front
Let us go forth, praising Jesus our Messiah.
During the procession all hold palms or branches, and sing the hymn 11 "All glory laud and honour"

The Collect

After the procession, when all are in their places, the president introduces a period of silent prayer with the words...

Let us pray for a closer union with Christ in his suffering and in his glory. Silence is kept.

Almighty and everlasting God, *ending* in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. **Amen.**

The Liturgy of the Word

Readings

One reading from Scripture precedes the Gospel reading. At the end the reader may say
This is the word of the Lord.

Thanks be to God.

Hymn 346 "My song is love unknown"

The Passion Reading

Praise to you, O Christ, King of eternal glory. Christ humbled himself and became obedient unto death, even death on a cross.

Therefore, God has highly exalted him and given him the name that is above every name.

Praise to you, O Christ, King of eternal glory.

The Passion of our Lord Jesus Christ according to *N. At the end*This is the Passion of the Lord.

No response is made.

Sermon

Silence may be kept.

Prayers of Intercession are said

The response to the prayers is let us pray to the Lord. Lord, have mercy.

At the end of the prayers all say Holy God, holy and strong, holy and immortal, have mercy upon us.

The Liturgy of the Sacrament

The Peace

Once we were far off, but now in union with Christ Jesus we have been brought near through the shedding of Christ's blood, for he is our peace.

The peace of the Lord be always with you and also with you.

Let us offer one another a socially distanced sign of peace All may exchange a sign of peace. Hymn 227 "I come with joy"

Preparation of the Table Taking of the Bread and Wine

The table is prepared and this prayer may be said Jesus, true vine and bread of life, ever giving yourself that the world might live, let us share your death and passion: make us perfect in your love. **Amen.**

The president takes the bread and wine.

....all honour and glory be yours, almighty Father, for ever and ever. **Amen.**

Breaking of the Bread

you humbled yourself in taking the form of a servant, and in obedience died on the cross for our salvation: give us the mind to follow you and to proclaim you as Lord and King, to the glory of God the Father. **Amen.**

Faithful God,
may we who share this banquet
glory in the cross of our Lord Jesus Christ,
our salvation, life and hope,
who reigns as Lord now and for ever. Amen.
